A record 239 aspiring leaders competed for a place on the Fellowship and Fuad was one of the 24 Fellows appointed.

Founded in October 2008, The Clore Social Leadership Programme aims to grow and develop the leadership capability of "tomorrow's world changers". This year, Clore Social worked with partners to offer new Specialist Fellowships and awarded Fuad with a Specialist Migrant Communities Fellowship supported by the Paul Hamlyn Foundation – a lead contributor of funding to refugees in the UK.
