We often cooked together and did social activities together. Some of us also went to college together, which was great. At ACH I enjoyed the English classes with Amy. These helped me to learn English, which I am really happy about. I also enjoyed the IT class with Rashid and Lea. I learnt good things and I can now use basic Microsoft Word. Thank you for your help.”
